Wishing you Happy Holidays and a healthy, Happy New Year.

Thank you for giving your input on the Employee Engagement and the Culture of Safety surveys. We have received the results and are looking forward to your input on developing an action plan for improvement. Unlike many initiatives, changing the culture and aligning strategic goals of the organization to all employees is a transformation of care. Our results in comparison of benchmark results show that we have opportunity to improve

in areas such as teamwork among units. In order to transform our culture, we need to understand the data and confront it with a positive approach to move the needle in the right direction. This will require that we respect individual and group values, perceptions, behaviors and openly discuss information, report adverse events, near miss events, process problems and behavioral events. Events that are high severity events (never events) should be entered into our incident reporting system and escalated through the chain of command such as your manager, director, administrative executive, medical staff leadership and Quality and Risk. Improving safety requires an environment that understands that there will be errors and to not treat errors as personal, but rather an opportunity to improve the system and prevent harm. Your level of commitment and engagement as a key stakeholder by participating in the action planning process and reporting events will contribute to help us on the journey to improve the safety of our organization.







HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS

Do not leave packages or valuables on the seat of your car. This creates a temptation for thieves. If you must leave something in the car, lock it in the trunk or put it out of sight

Be sure to locate your keys prior to going to your car

Be aware of your surroundings. If you see any suspicious activity, notify the police, security, or appropriate personnel

Be extra cautious when using ATM's. Use machines located in highly populated areas and be aware of your surroundings

Avoid overloading yourself with packages. It is important to have clear visibility and freedom of motion When leaving home for an extended time, have a neighbor or family member watch your house and pick up your newspapers and mail, do not advertise your vacation plans, times you will be away from home or the amount of cash you are carrying.

Be extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave the house, even for a few minutes

While at work, lock valuables such as a purse, wallet and keys in desk drawers or other secured areas.

Many of you were recently involved in caring for the following:

A 29 year-old female who suffered from an Anoxia event. She had registered her wish to be an organ donor on the donor registry and we thank you for your support in making this happen.

Three people received the gift of life and are all recovering and doing well:

- A 70 year-old mother of two from Southern California received a new liver. She is recovering and doing well.
- A 43 year-old female from Southern California received a new right kidney. She is recovering and doing well.
- A 41 year-old male from Northern California received a new left kidney. He is recovering and doing well.

A 42 year-old male who suffered from a stroke. His family wanted him to be an organ donor:

Four people received the gift of life and are all recovering and doing well:

- A 67 year-old father of one from Southern California received a new heart.
- A 25 year-old male from Utah received a new liver.
- A 55 year-old father of two from Northern California received a new right kidney. He had been waiting 5 years.
- A 67 year-old father of two from Northern California received a new left kidney. He had been waiting for 6 years.
