Reflection and Self Care

As the end of the year approaches, I find it is a good time to seek out self-care and reflect on all the great things that have been accomplished over the year. Caregivers often forget about caring for themselves due to all the energy they give to taking care of others. Although caring for others is rewarding and fulfilling, it can be draining as well, so take care of yourself mentally and physically. Whatever works for you... whether it is a relaxing walk on the beach, a strenuous run or ride on the trails, a peaceful spiritual session with yoga or faith practice... take the time to be good to yourself.

Now, let's reflect on the summary of 2017 at Salinas Valley Memorial and recognize your significant accomplishments and contributions:

Quality and Patient Safety and Efficiencies

- Successful Joint Commission tri-annual survey accreditation for 3 years
- The Leapfrog Group once again gave Salinas Valley Memorial an "A" grade for patient safety.
- Implemented a nursing Shared Governance structure
- Developed Professional Practice Model, including nursing mission, vision nursing theorist and values as well as developed a nursing strategic plan
- Updated Meditech to 6.15 including additions of a critical care flow sheet, VS interface, IV infusion and titration screen and mange transfer functionality

- Completed ED remodel & implemented a Rapid Medical Evaluation (RME) process with significant improvements on length of stay and time from order to admission
- Improved the efficiencies in the OR on first case on time starts up to 84.5% and turn- around times down to 31.2 minutes
- Completed OB door construction to improve efficiency and employee satisfaction
- Added toileting rounds and focused on Fall reduction with improved Fall rate from 2.77 falls per 1000 patient days down to 1.45 in last quarter
- Implemented Huddles and added Huddle boards in clinical departments
- Streamlined our processes to better identify patients with Sepsis for early interventions
- Developed effective process to ensure patients are referred to the Diabetic Center
- Successful certifications surveys for Mammography and Sleep Centers
- Perinatal staff focused on providing high touch labor support and family/support person involvement and improved outcomes by increased vaginal births and reduction of primary cesareans

Service

- Supported huge transition to Room Service
- Refreshed our ICU/CCU
- Added Braham's lullaby music after a baby is born
- Hardwired Bedside Report
- Developed patient folders for ED and Inpatient to improve patient communication
- Implemented leader and charge nurse MyRounding. (There is a positive correlation to improved HCAPHS scores with leader rounding)
- Outcomes show significant improvement of Press Ganey HCAHP Composite results in 2017 in the following categories:
 - Hospital Rating
 - o Responsiveness of Staff (see graph below of positive trend)
 - o Communication about Medications
 - Hospital Environment (specifically related to Cleanliness)






