Service Initiatives

Scores continue to have positive trends in our patient satisfaction. Please keep up the great service! Our opportunities for improvement are in Communication of Medication Side effects and Noise at Night. If you are in a charge nurse role, remember to **perform leader rounding with the IPAD MyRounding application** because data shows that a patient's perception of experience significantly improves when rounded on by a nurse leader. Beginning July 1, we have made a change to post our data Patient Satisfaction Data based on *Receive Date* rather than *Discharge Date*. The reason for this change is two-fold. Our data will be final at the end of the month rather than a two month delay while we wait for the surveys to come in and this is

how CMS also reports HCAHPS data. **Good news is on the horizon!** Our **Medical Hospitalists join SVMC** beginning 8/1/2017. We anticipate an improvement in service as we onboard loyal physicians which will result in a more consistent physician staffing model, dedicated physician administrative time, less locums and more physician engagement. This month SVMH will begin serving a **special meal for our new mothers** and their significant other. We will also be rolling out a **new patient folders specifically for the ED and the Inpatient** areas to help the patients better organize their patient data and education.

Quality Initiatives

We have completed our validation of the Patient Classifications (Acuity) system. The results will be shared with the task force for later this month to evaluate if we need to make further changes in the electronic data mapping. 





Dedicated Nursing Staff in NICU

I wanted to share with you how fortunate I am to work with such a dedicated nursing staff in the NICU. I could cite several examples from both our day and night staff. However, I must highlight the events that occurred the other day in our NICU.

We had received a transport from Lucille Packard Children Hospital (LPCH), an ex-27 week very low birth weight infant who was now in his 4th week of life, but still was requiring non-invasive ventilator support. Although he was stable, when he arrived, his oxygen requirements were moderately high and had increased even in the days prior to transport. We discovered that he was significantly anemic and would require a blood transfusion. Due to his decreased blood count and current size, 1100 grams or 2 lb. 6 oz., obtaining intravenous access for this urgent blood transfusion was extremely difficult and appeared not possible. I was so impressed by the commitment of our nursing staff that day, Jan L. [Hadden], Esther L. [Bronson] and Maura E. [Baker], who diligently attempted to secure this needed IV access. As I was communicating with LPCH regarding assistance and possible back-transport to their facility, Jan [Hadden] obtained peripheral IV access and the Baby received the packed red blood cells over a 4-hour period that day. Of note, his oxygen requirements decreased significantly and has remained clinically stable in our NICU.

I am so appreciative of that shift's commitment and the level of care provided by all our NICU RNs, RCP and other important ancillary staff that care for our babies and parents.
