QUALITY/SERVICE:

- We are finalizing the Nursing Strategic Plan and Professional Practice Model/Theory. The councils and Professional Practice Team are working on dissemination and an education plan.
- Meditech Ambulatory is going live at our first site (Taylor Farms) in November and there is plan for implementation at Doctors on Duty, PrimeCare and SVMC clinics over the next 6 months.
- We are in process of initiating the nasal antiseptic swabs prior to Cardiac surgery and we are evaluating extending this process for other surgical procedures to reduce surgical site infections.
- Inpatient Wound Care RNs are being moved from Outpatient Wound Care to report under Agnes Lalata, MedSurg Director, to enhance collaboration between inpatient RNs and Wound Care RNs.







