## Mask Up Monterey County & COVID-19 Updates

This summer, our community faced the dual challenges of an ongoing battle with COVID-19, as well as wildfires that damaged many homes and led to poor air quality in Monterey County. Salinas Valley Memorial Healthcare System partnered with several other area hospitals to remind residents of the persisting threat to public health and to ask

everyone to continue social distancing efforts, including wearing masks to keep themselves and the rest of our community as safe as possible. The best thing we can do to slow the spread has not changed – through **#MaskUpMontereyCounty**, health and wellness leaders in our region remind us each and every day about the actions that we can each take as individuals to continue to care for each other during these difficult times.

The enduring effects of the pandemic have also impacted health system staff in significant ways. An innovative initiative this summer, the **SVMHS Community and Staff Support Project** (CSSP), helped SVMHS employees who experienced a reduction in their routine surgery and procedure schedules find other valuable work in the community, which in turn, enabled them to maintain their salary and benefits at the healthcare system. This program provided stability for health system employees and redistributed their talents to other community organizations that needed extra support responding to needs related to COVID-19. Participating organizations ranged from the Salvation Army to homeless shelters in the county, as well as internal efforts tied to distributing masks to health system employees and supporting and staffing our COVID-19 telephone hotline.

#### October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

In October we recognize Breast Cancer Awareness Month and this year we also reflect on 10 years of the Nancy Ausonio Mammography Center. Local philanthropist Nancy Ausonio generously donated the funds to bring this Center to life, offering life-saving care to our community such as 3D mammography services, breast



ultrasounds, and bone density scans. It is designated as a Breast Imaging Center of Excellence by the American College of Radiology, and boasts a staff of passionate, certified specialists that care for 23,000 patients annually since the Center opened in 2010. **Meet some of the dedicated staff** in this 'Ten Years, Ten Facts' video.
